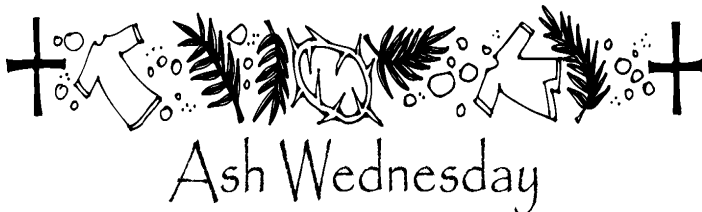

GO TO COLLEGE AND HIT THE BOOKS

"Hitting the books" may take different forms these days--since books are now not just print, but electronic. But college-bound students (and their parents) are often stunned by the cost of required texts, one more reminder of the financial commitment involved in the pursuit of a college education.

Fortunately, for 19 years the Salem Scholarship program has assisted 56 Salem members in their pursuit of a higher degree. Salem Scholarships and Educational Grants recognize academic achievement; Christian character, service, and citizenship; and educational and career goals. They may take financial need into consideration, but it is not a necessary requirement. They are renewable for up to four years.

WELCOME PASTOR RICKEL AND ST. DYSMUS

Pastor Gerry Rickel, the new pastor of the Community of St. Dysmus, now has his office here at Salem. St. Dysmus is a prison congregation composed of several correctional facilities at Jessup and Hagerstown. It was the very first prison congregation in the United States. Pastor Rickel will be preaching here at Salem on Sunday, February 19th and will share with us the Gospel and information about his ministry among some of the most forgotten in our society. Pastor Rickel also has responsibility for the new Lutheran Seafarer's Ministry located in Baltimore.

Salem Youth Group Thermal Lunch Tote Fundraiser



The Salem Youth Group will be selling great thermal tote lunch bags from Thirty-One Gifts between services every Sunday from January 29 through February 19 and at the Annual Meeting. The name Thirty-One comes from the verses of Proverbs 31. The Proverbs 31 woman is dearly loved and respected by him and her children, yet she is an individual in her own right.

The fundraiser includes the original *Thermal Totes* in 12 designs for \$18 or the NEW *Cinch-It-Up Thermal Tote* in 5 designs for \$23. **Pricing includes tax and shipping.** (Thermal totes are priced \$15 and Cinch-It-Up totes are priced \$20 before tax and shipping.)

Both totes are thermally lined (non-mercury containing liner) to keep warm food warm, and cold food cold and feature a sturdy handle and front pocket for napkins, utensils, or little notes. The Guardians of Eden hopes you will buy these “green” lunch totes as a way to cut down on use of disposable plastic or paper bags!

You can personalize the thermal tote for only \$7 with a name or initials or a cute saying like “lunch time” or “snack attack”. If you have a child with food allergies embroidering their tote with “peanut allergy” may be a helpful way of warning others. They are also great for refrigerated medicines you need to bring on the go.

Orders will be available for pick-up from church approximately 2-3 weeks after the fundraiser ends.

A portion of proceeds from each tote will be donated to help support the Salem Youth trip to New Orleans for the 2012 Lutheran National Youth Gathering.

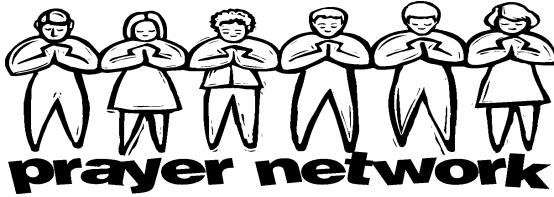
HISTORICAL OLD SALEM'S CRAFT FAIR & FLEA MARKET
